#### BY BIKE

There are many hiking and cycling routes in Costa Blanca, the Orihuela Costa is the most well-known. This paved coastal path can be tackled in sections or all in one go.

#### BY TAXI

There is nothing complicated about booking Costa Blanca taxis, you can find them at all the major cities and towns.
