Location & Local Information

In the heart of Tuscany, the Chianti region unfurls as a tapestry of lush vineyards and mediaeval towns, with Florence's artistic grandeur and Siena's Gothic charm serving as cultural bookends to this picturesque landscape.

Begin your journey in Florence, the cradle of the Renaissance, where every cobblestone whispers tales of artistic and architectural marvels. 

For the active soul, the Chianti Hills present a labyrinth of hiking and cycling trails, offering panoramic vistas that stretch to the horizon. Pause for a picnic beside a serene lake or rejuvenate in the embrace of natural springs.

An hour's drive from the vine-clad hills, Siena stands as a mediaeval masterpiece, its Piazza del Campo echoing with the thundering hooves of the Palio horse race. Wander the narrow alleys and be rewarded with hidden enclaves and the warm welcome of local trattorias, where the robust flavours of Tuscan cuisine are a wonderful match for a glass of ruby-red Chianti.

Not to be overlooked, Arezzo, with its renowned antique market and Piero della Francesca's frescoes, offers a quieter but equally enriching cultural experience. Here, history is palpable in the old town's streets, a canvas of past and present.

In Chianti, every sense is engaged, every moment a memory in the making. Whether it's the taste of robust wine, the sight of a sunset over Florence, or the touch of history in Siena, this region is a symphony of experiences, waiting to be savoured by the discerning traveller.
